Gwangju Metropolitan City is hosting the 8th World Human Rights Cities Forum. Since it was first held in 2011, World Human Rights Cities Forum has solidified its place as an international forum to learn, share and maximize the capacity of expertise and experience in the human rights arena, especially among the human rights cities. In WHRCF 2018, the theme of “Whom do we live with?” will be discussed with three sub-themes of “Diversity, Inclusiveness, and Peace” in nine thematic sessions in addition to many plenary and special session.

WHRCF 2018 is inviting researchers, activists and students to present papers on human rights. We hereby are calling for papers not only on this year’s theme but also human rights issues in general. Approved submissions will be presented either in the Professional Session for professional researchers including graduate students or in the Student Session for undergraduate students.

FORMAT

Abstracts need to be within 500 words. Papers are required to be from 15 to 25 pages in length single spaced (A4). All papers are recommended to follow the APA stylesheet in Microsoft Word File or Hancom Office File. English is required for abstracts, papers, and presentations.

PUBLICATION

All submissions will be reviewed by the members of the paper assessment committee and chosen for the Human Rights Paper Presentation for either the professional or student session. WHRCF 2018 will publish the chosen papers on its website as well as all abstracts and other results of the Forum such as presentations and discussions. In addition to publishing submissions online, certain papers will also be selected by a panel and published within the Chonnam National University Law School’s ‘Human Rights Law Review’. Submissions only from individuals who are PhD holders, PhD candidates, full-time faculty members of a university or college, or legal experts are eligible to be selected and published within the Human Rights Law Review.

HONORARIUM: USD \$120, an additional USD \$550 for selections of the Human Rights Law Review

PRESENTATION

Paper presenters may choose how they want to present (i.e. PPT, Prezi or other ways). Each presenter will be given 15 minutes to present, followed by 10 minutes Q&A. Presentations should be given in English.
