Background and goals of the meeting

The Committee on Social Inclusion, Participatory Democracy and Human Rights aims to contribute to articulating a common voice for cities in UCLG on social inclusion, participatory democracy, human rights, and the right to the city, as well as to advise local governments on the design of these policies.

The origins of the Committee lie in the first events of the **Forum of Local Authorities for Social Inclusion and Participatory Democracy** (FAL), a space for political discussion made up by local authorities from all over the world which has taken places since 2001 in the framework of every World Social Forum (WSF).

Since its creation in 2005, the Committee has been present at the various FAL events and has maintained an ongoing dialogue with international social movements and civil society in the international social forums held in **Caracas**, 2005; **Nairobi**, 2007; **Belém do Pará**, 2009; **Dakar**, 2011; **Tunis**, 2013 and 2015. It has thus become the bridge between the political debates held inside the FAL (and WSF) and UCLG.

Besides this, it has undertaken its own political work to foster local policies of social inclusion, participatory democracy, human rights and right to the city through different type of activities: advocacy, exchange of experiences, production of knowledge and networking.

Some of the tangible results of our work up to date are:

- Organisation of the 1st World Summit of Local Governments for the Right to the City (Saint-Denis, 2012) that was attended by around 200 participants and a total of 40 speakers from 16 countries (Austria, Belgium, Bosnia-Herzegovina, Brazil, Burundi, Canada, France, Mexico, Portugal, Senegal, Slovenia, Spain, South Korea, Switzerland, The Netherlands, and the United States of America).
- The Global Charter-Agenda for Human Rights in the City, adopted by UCLG in 2011, and the European Charter for Human Rights in the City (Saint-Denis, 2000). The goal of these tools lies in the implementation of the right to the city through municipal policies and citizens' involvement in the design, monitoring and evaluation of these.
- The <u>Inclusive Cities Observatory</u>, a virtual platform launched in 2009 that contains 65 case studies on innovative policies for community development, access to public services, gender equality, environmental protection or poverty eradication, among other issues. This tool aims to promote the exchange of good practices and learning between cities.



- The document "For a world of inclusive cities", adopted in 2008 by UCLG, which is now the political position on social inclusion of the international organization
- Organization of the 1st International Seminar of Innovative Local Policies for Social Inclusion (Barcelona, 2007) involving 15 cities around the world to exchange experiences and good practices.
- Numerous <u>debates and round tables</u> on social inclusion, participatory democracy, human rights and right to the city, which took place in the framework of several international events, organized by city networks, United Nations agencies or civil society organizations.
- Political cooperation with several **city networks** (the <u>FAL</u>, <u>Forum of Local Authorities</u> for Social Inclusion and Participatory Democracy; the FALP, <u>Forum of Peripheral Local Authorities</u>; the IOPD, <u>International Observatory on Participatory Democracy</u>; <u>Mercociudades</u>...), others **UCGL committees** (Culture, Local Economic Development) and with **civil society organizations** (HIC <u>Habitat International Coalition</u>; IDHC, <u>Human Rights Institute of Catalonia</u>; <u>Polis Institute</u>, Brazil; <u>CIVICUS</u>; KHRF <u>Korea Human Rights Foundation</u>). This networking has led to advocacy initiatives and exchange of experiences, such as the launch of a <u>political declaration</u> on the concept note of the 7th World Urban Forum (Medellín, April 2014), signed by the Committee, the FALP, Mercociudades and HIC; participation at the <u>3rd FALP</u> (Canoas, June 2013) or at the International Seminar "Climate change: a challenge for the construction of a sustainable and solidarity-based metropolis (São Leopoldo and Canoas, January 2012), organized by the FALP; among others initiatives.
- Institutional collaboration with international organizations such as <u>UNESCO</u>, <u>UNHABITAT</u>, <u>ILO</u>, the European Union (EU) <u>Fundamental Rights Agency</u> (FRA) and the <u>Council of Europe</u> (CoE).
- **Communication tools:** a webpage (www.uclg-cisdp.org), newsletters, mailing of circulars to members, active presence in social networks (Facebook: cisdp); Twitter: uclg-cisdp), brochures and launch of a small collection of publications that includes the European Charter for Human Rights in the City and For a World of Inclusive Cities.

Finally, since 2014, the Committee has been actively participating in the Definition of the New Global Urban Agenda in order to promote the right to the city, human rights, participation and social inclusion. This involvement, in collaboration with civil society partners, has been achieved through several ways:

- Involvement of Patrick Braouezec, Co-president of the Committee on Social Inclusion, Participatory Democracy and Human Rights into the work of the <u>Global Task Force</u>. This Task Force is coordinated by UCLG to bring the messages of local governments for the New Agenda.
- Building substantive proposals of local governments, particularly on peripheral cities and inclusive cities issues, within the GOLD IV report coordinated by the World Secretary of UCLG
- Involvement into the <u>Global Platform for the Right to the City</u>. This Platform gathers civil society and local authorities' organizations since 2014 with the aim of promoting the right to the city in the world and in particular in the definition of the New Global Urban Agenda.

The first 2015 Biannual Meeting will deal with the Committee's strategies: (i) **foster human rights and the right to the city at local level;** and (ii) **influence the New Urban Agenda** that will be adopted at the **Habitat III** United Nations Conference.

To enhance this work from the plurality of cities which are contributing to the development of its activities, a new Collective Presidency will be presented.
